


Jimmy Bluefeather by Kim Heacox



SUMMARY

Old Keb Wisting is somewhere around ninety-five years old (he lost count a while ago), in constant pain and thinks he wants to die. He also thinks he thinks too much. Part Norwegian and part Tlingit Native, he's the last living canoe carver in the village of Jinkaat in Alaska. When his grandson, James, a promising basketball player, ruins his leg in a logging accident and tells his grandpa that he has nothing left to live for, Old Keb comes alive and finishes his last canoe, with help from his grandson. Together (with a few friends and a crazy but likeable dog named Steve) they embark on a great canoe journey. They paddle deep into wild Alaska, but mostly into the human heart, in a story of adventure, love, and reconciliation.
