
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

EVENT HIGHLIGHTS


- The Friends annual program garnered 48 attendees. The event featured Devan Anderson from Preservation Detroit.

Updates in The Lab

We completed the reorganization of The Lab, which now includes space for sewing machines, exhaust for a laser cutter, and a high top table for tinkering projects. The instructor station was moved to the entry of the space to provide a more welcoming atmosphere for patrons trying out the tools for the first time. We will be conducting orientation with the Teen STEM Corps members on June 16 and begin staffing The Lab for all open hours starting the week of June 19.

Walldorf/Dunning AV Project Completion

The technology upgrades for the Walldorf/Dunning Rooms are nearing completion. There are a few small fixes that Sound Planning is currently addressing to make the setup even more seamless for users. Staff has been trained and are getting used to using the new equipment to support programming going forward.



FACILITIES

HVAC updates

Robertson Morrison was brought in to address a leaky access panel in the Main Level Staff Area. They also performed preventative maintenance.

Keeth Heating supplied a quarterly filter change to our system and installed an exhaust fan in the Lab to support the use of our new laser cutter. This necessitated a hole to be drilled out the building on the upper level for a direct exhaust vent.

Outdoor Services

Sprinkler repairs were made by Transitions Outdoors. We are also reevaluating our irrigation needs in light of upcoming changes to the library's planting schemes.

Friends Room Updates

New flooring for the space will be installed in early July. Yong Heo is also working on reframing the library's 39 star flag to hang in the space.

Roof Access Construction

As of the writing of this report, construction is ongoing and expected to wrap up soon. City Contracting has been installing the new ladder access point for the past week.

Current Inspections

To keep our annual inspections up-to-date, Yong Heo brought in OK Fire and Dwight Govan to complete our elevator and fire extinguisher inspections. We also worked with Genson Plumbing on our backflow testing.
