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
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
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CIRCULATION

PHYSICAL COLLECTIONS

Physical circulation increased by over 10k during the month of June, surpassing prior year circulation by about 2%. We expect that July and August will follow this trend.





DIGITAL COLLECTIONS

Both eResource and Database use is up over the previous month.

We now have a combined digital and physical circulation of 388k, at 92% of our goal so far this year.

Library Visits



PROJECT UPDATES

Farmer's Market

PDL staff are hosting booths at many of the Satuday Farmer's Markets. At the two events held in June, staff interacted with over 200 people. We have received positive feedback from the Chamber about our inclusion in the markets.

Community Conversations

The library has been hosting a series of conversations to gain insight on the needs of our neighbors and how the library can play a larger role in actualizing community aspirations. We hosted two productive focus groups for the public in June and plan to host two additional sessions by invite-only in July. A complementary online survey is also being distributed and has over 100 responses from across the community.

PDL hosted a booth at the first Plymouth Pride event in Old Village. While the library received public backlash on social media for our participation, there was a lot more positivity and good conversations at the actual event itself.

SPECIAL PROJECTS

Software and Hardware Deployment

IT staff have been working to transition staff and public PCs to a new way of supporting access to Adobe Creative Suite. The team also replaced all of our old UPS machines for our servers and are working behind the scenes to prepare librarians to transition from desktop machines to laptops to support enhanced mobility.

Outdoor Audio in Amphitheater

After having some time to learn more about the audio needs of programs in the Amphitheater, we are ready to install a more professional audio set up with funding from the Wilcox Foundation. We are anticipating the project to take place later in the fall, after the majority of the summer programs are finished. Until then, the IT team is setting up a mobile audio system for each program.

Mobile App Updates

The new mobile application is set to launch for the public on July 26. It will be made available to staff the week prior to support their training.

Passed Inspections

The library passed a number of recent midyear inspections, including the fire alarm system, the fire extinguishers, the generator, and the backflow testing of fire suppression, sprinklers, and boilers.

Contract Reviews

Facilities Coordinator Loreen Graham is currently in talks to review contracts with the following vendors: BASS (for our HVAC controls), Guardian Alarm (for our security alarm system), and OTIS (for our elevator maintenance). Each will be scheduled onsite this month to discuss cost savings opportunities and expectations for services provided.

The Facilities team is gathering quotes to support various electrical and lighting repairs, gutter maintenance, and wood rot repair.
