



## PHYSICAL COLLECTIONS

Physical circulation started to increase once again, slightly above 2023 levels. This past month, we launched the Holiday Display in the lobby, which offered a curated selection of diverse holiday materials to celebrate the season.





## DIGITAL COLLECTIONS

Both eResource and Database usage increased over the previous month and exceeded our monthly goal for eResource usage.

We now have a combined digital and physical circulation of 643k, at 83% of our goal so far this year.

#### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS





## PROJECT UPDATES

#### **Honoring Veterans**

The library hosted our annual displays honoring veterans. We hosted a "white table" display outside of the Walldorf Dunning Room, a community-produced photograph display in the lobby, and a historic military uniform in our glass display case.

#### **Community Outreach**

Library staff members attended the annual Chamber Gala and connected with the new bookstore in town (Elephant Ear Bookstore).

#### **Community Partnerships**

The library worked with Wayne County and Wayne State University to install a "Well Wayne Station" stocked with free overdose rescue materials and public health information. We also hosted a collection for the United Way Hats for the Homeless program.

# TECHNOLOGY

## SPECIAL PROJECTS

#### **New IT Installations**

Security 101 replaced the library's failing security camera server with a new reliable model that was approved by the library board. This continues to move the library toward fully upgraded and streamlined server infrastructure.

#### **ILS Updates**

We are in the middle of public preview for BiblioCommons, and the feedback so far has been overwhelmingly positive. The full public launch is on December 12. We are beginning to work with Equinox on the back-end transition, but we are held up in contract review with our attorney.

# FACILITIES

#### New Vending Machines

Installed, at no charge, a new energy efficient, cash or credit, beverage and snack vending machines in the recently refreshed guest beverage area on the main level.

#### Inspections Completed

The City of Plymouth DMS Cross Connection Control Program performed an inspection by HydroCorp of the library's internal water system for connections that potentially could contaminate the water distribution system. Minor discrepancies were noted with minimal follow-up repairs to the premises. We also completed rooftop unit and drain inspections with the new HVAC service provider. No issues were found.

#### Holiday Lights

Executive Property Maintenance installed exterior holiday lights throughout the landscaping near the parking lot and along Main Street. Minor repairs had to be made to a few outdoor electrical outlets, but all lighting is now functional and looking festive.

#### Brick Wall in Parking Lot

The brick wall along the Union St. parking lot was repaired after someone ran into it last month. The driver of the vehicle was a licensed builder and performed the repair at no charge to the library.

#### **HVAC Repair**

Urgent repairs were required on the library's humidifiers on the upper level after loud noises were reported one weekend. Both humidifier canisters were replaced and the source of the noise was fixed.
