


New Chapter at Plymouth District Library



This summer, we will embark on a renovation to refresh and reimagine how we serve the community. The multi-phase project will update every floor with new designs, expanded features, and welcoming spaces, all while keeping the library open for patrons. Renovations begin June 2nd, starting with the upper level, which will temporarily close for the summer. Updates include new paint, carpeting, additional study rooms, and a drive-thru window for material pickups. Later phases will upgrade the main level and the lower level, home to the Youth Department, with a brief closure of the entire building planned for September.

Designs by MCD Architects will blend familiar warmth with a classic, timeless style. Updates will include more seating, expanded children's areas, improved technology, and enhanced service spaces.
