

CIRCULATION

PHYSICAL COLLECTIONS

Circulation decreased for our physical collections during the two week closure, but not as low as anticipated, likely due to the Drive-Thru service and interest in the updates after reopening. Our collection utilization dipped to 11% as a result.





DIGITAL COLLECTIONS

eResources increased significantly during the building closure. Interestingly, database usage dipped significantly, likely alluding to the number of patrons who use databases in our building or staff who use databases during reference transactions with the public.

We are at a combined circulation of 467k, which is 95% of our monthly KPI.

Our collection size is 160,227 with 2,379 new items added this month and 10,421 withdrawn.



This month, there was a significant dip in all areas of participation as a result of the 2 week building closure for our interior renovation.


PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

PROJECT UPDATES

Fall Festival

Fall Fest was a huge success! We welcomed over 1,300 visitors to our booth and folks of all ages made close to 800 heishi bead bracelets. The library also sponsored one of the stage performers for the event, which had over 350 people in the audience.

School Outreach

Library staff visited both Starkweather High School and Farrant Elementary School, participating with over 100 individuals.

Community Outreach

PDL staff engaged with kids at Downtown Day, showcasing our Library of Things with STEAM kit activities. Staff also tabled at the Senior Picnic, sharing program information and renovation updates.



Paging System Implementation

Our brand new paging system was installed during the two week closure, and it is working well for our purposes. The system is integrated into our phones to support emergency messages throughout the building in addition to playing scheduled messaging/other sounds in different areas of the building.

Technology Commons Opening

IT staff helped assemble the new Technology Commons, which includes both public access computers, scanning/copying equipment, and maker technology. As we are able to, we will begin rolling back out the use of maker equipment for the public in the new space.

FACILITIES

Work Orders Processed

Facilities staff worked through a total of 115 work orders this month (30 of which are still open). Support was regularly requested this month related to building repair issues or furniture moving.

HVAC Repairs

BC Ten Air replaced a malfunctioning water alarm sensor on one of our rooftop units in addition to replacing a broken fan in one of our boilers. Afterward, the boilers received chemical treatment to keep them in sound functioning order.

Lighting Repairs/Replacement

PDL maintenance staff tested over (50) T8 ballasts on the main floor and replaced (40) lightbulbs, focusing on the main entrance and the corridor outside the meeting rooms to improve lighting with the darker paint colors.

Building Renovations

Currently, all areas of the library are now functional and usable for the public. We are still waiting on construction to begin on the Lower Level play area and for a few furniture pieces with longer lead times to arrive. Overall, the feedback from the public has been overwhelmingly positive.
