

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Circulation is still down over prior year, but eResources are in high demand.

CIRCULATION

PHYSICAL COLLECTIONS

Circulation is still low compared to previous years. We see this trend showing up most acutely in our youth collections which have not yet recovered from the closure in September. Our collection utilization is slowly increasing, now at 12%.



DIGITAL COLLECTIONS

eResources went up significantly, likely due to New Year's resolutions— we saw a ton of usage in Hoopla. We set new daily budgets to help us stay within our allotted spending. Database usage went up slightly.

We ended the month with a combined circulation of just under 64k, which is 91% of our monthly goal.

Our collection size is 164,586 with 2,676 new items added this month and 1,228 withdrawn.



IT Recabling Projects

The IT team is preparing for another recabling project on our Upper Level that will occur during our Staff Day closure on 2/16.

IT staff also prepped the ceiling on the Lower Level to ensure that all cables were dealt with before significant work was completed in the new playspace.

MeLCat Success

We are now seeing successful delete files being uploaded to MeLCat from our vendors at Equinox. This makes the requesting process seamless for our users while also simplifying work on the staff end.

ILS Updates

I started hosting a Catalog Development Working Group to help us make progress on stabilizing our ILS and optimizing the system for various aspects of library work flows.

FACILITIES

Work Orders Processed

Facilities staff worked through a total of 66 work orders this month (35 of which are still open). Support was regularly requested this month related to repairs and maintenance along with extra cleaning needed outside of regular maintenance schedules.

Maintenance Projects

Our HVAC vendor completed our semi-annual snow melt system maintenance. This included glycol replacement, relief valve replacement, and tuning of the new glycol feeder.

PDL recycled over 100 used/burnt-out fluorescent light bulbs and a large collection of used batteries.

Facilities supported the installation of appropriate backflow system pieces and reviewed with HydroCorp for compliance.

Facilities staff also replaced the p-trap on the Upper Level that was causing slow drainage in the women's restroom sink, and installed a new dome light cover and reinforced the fasteners on a large overhead ML light fixture that fell from the frame and shattered earlier this month.

Building Renovations

Construction continues on the Lower Level playscape. Due to the recent large donation to the library, we are considering a few updates provided by our designers that we postponed due to budget constraints. This will be presented at a future board meeting.
