The library has generous community volunteers who assist with programs and various other library activities. One of our regulars, Toni Jones, spends her Wednesday mornings at Super-Sized Storytime, greeting children and their caregivers for 30 minutes of songs, rhymes, stories, and joy.

For the past two and a half years, Miss Toni (as the librarians and patrons know her), a retired educator, has given her time to watch children's faces light up as stories are read to them, bubbles are popped, and songs are sung. During a Super-Sized Storytime on a chilly morning in early February, she served as the "counter" for the program, keeping track of the number of children and caregivers who walked through the door. She greeted them with a smile on her face, recognizing families from previous weeks and urging them to scoot up close to see and hear the story better. She also guarded the door to ensure no toddlers escaped without their caregiver close behind. Writing Opportunities for All Ages 🖋️


Calling all writers! Join one of our writing groups or clubs to meet new faces and practice your writing skills:




The Astral Library by Kate Quinn
