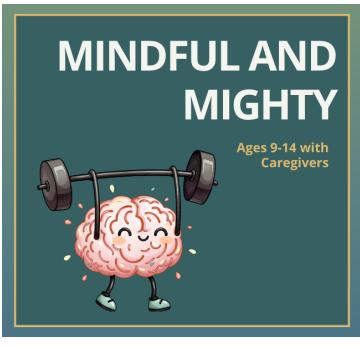

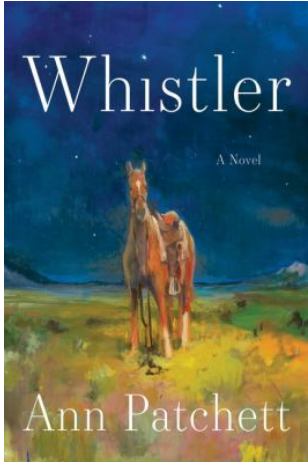
Register Now: K-Pop Idol School

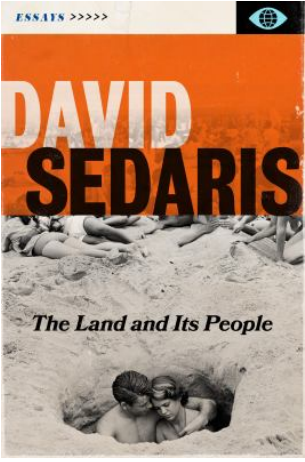

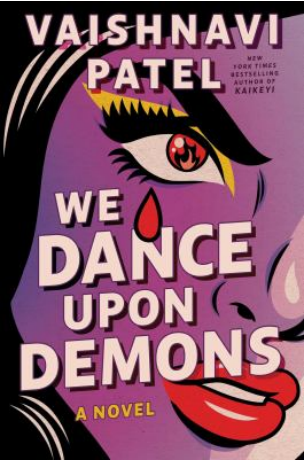
Whistler by Ann Patchett

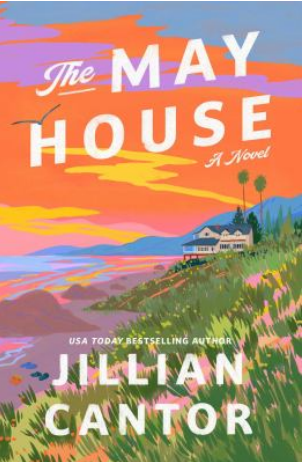
The Land and Its People by David Sedaris
