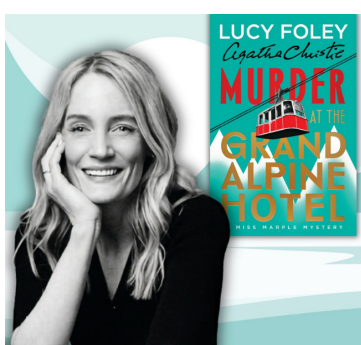
Here at the library, we want to create programming that meets the needs of our community members, allowing them to participate in events that pique their interests and help them learn something new.

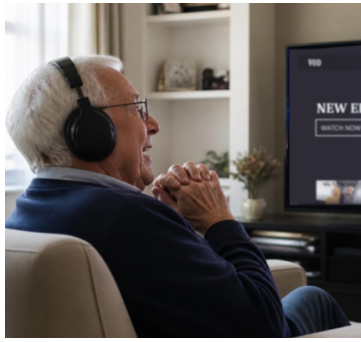


School Start Midday Matinee

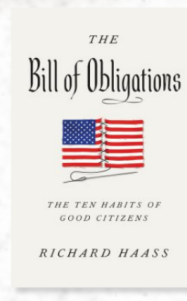

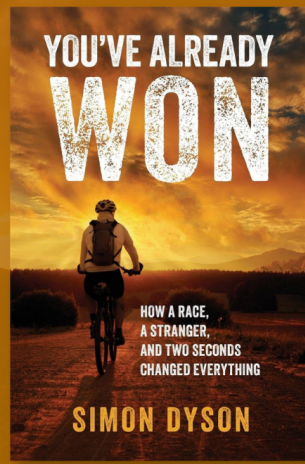
The [kids' group](#) will be discussing the graphic novel *Act* by Kayla Miller. Books are now available at the Youth desk.

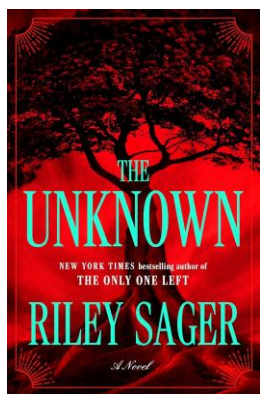


Save the Date: Local Author Talk

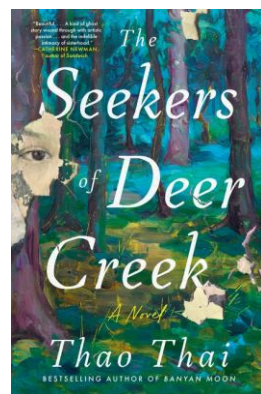
Vera Stein Is Fine by Julie Murphy
