The entire program will be conducted by certified Heartfulness trainers, who have been meditating and training for several years. Ages 15 and up.



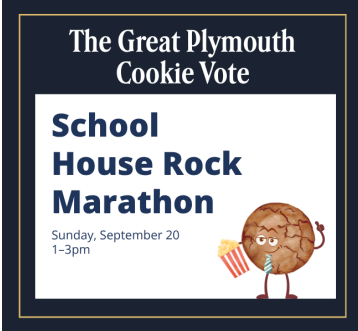
Film Screening - Free for All: The Public Library

- Donation of stand alone costume parts/accessories are also welcome.

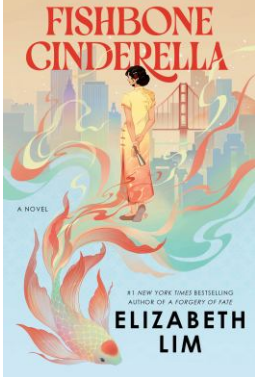

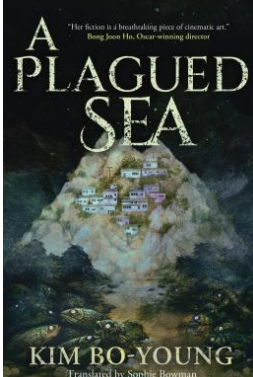
Meet Me in Paris by Kristin Harmel

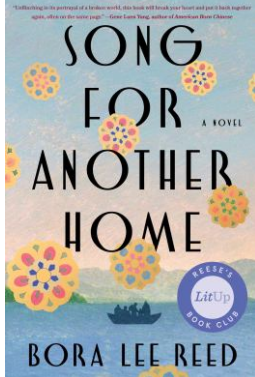
Fishbone Cinderella by Elizabeth Lim
