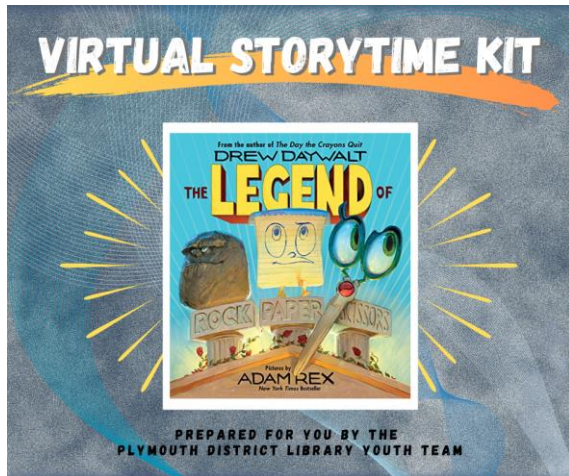


Virtual Storytime Kit

Extension Activities:
