Extension Activities:

1. Give yourself a unicorn makeover to follow rules 1 and 2! Have some fun with your hair--make it crazy, or look up videos for how to give it a new cool style. Then make your own unicorn horn! Color or decorate a piece of cardstock, roll up the paper diagonally into a horn shape, tape it closed, punch holes in the bottom, and use yarn to attach it. If you only have printer paper, try rolling it around a toilet paper tube to keep it stiff enough to stand up on top of your head.
2. The unicorns enjoyed seeing sparkly butterflies on their special day. You can too! Research good plants to attract butterflies and make a plan to plant some in your own yard. You may be able to find seeds for sale online, or keep your plans handy for when restrictions loosen again.

4. It's not a party without cupcakes! Bake some cupcakes, cookies, or other family favorite together. (Following a recipe and measuring ingredients are great learning activities for kids.)
